- Babergh now split into two areas East and West
- Resources have got to be much more flexible these days, policing has changed so much over the past 20 years or so.
- Safeguarding, gang violence, Mental health issues, missing people, cyber crime examples of areas todays police are involved with. Gang violence in Ipswich is impacting on police work in rural areas.
- Parish forums are held regularly to replace PCSOs attending PC meetings
- **Big increases in calls to police** 101 service up 12%, 999 calls up 33% due to people wanting help/support knowing that the police is one of the few 24/7 services. Mental health staff sometimes on duty with police at call centres.
- Strong feeling from reps at the meeting that rural areas are being left to their own devices
- **Travellers** are a big concern in rural areas, especially over the summer, but there have been no major issues in Babergh this year.
- Many complaints over the long waiting time for the 101 service...
 PLEASE DON"T GIVE UP. HANG ON. ALL CONCERNS MUST BE REPORTED TO THE POLICE
- **Project 25** currently reviewing police procedures so that a further £4 million savings can be made on top of previous savings.
- Little Waldingfield 8 houses burgled in one night
- **PSCOs** don't work after 6pm
- **Cuts in funding** only solution is a political one. Harass your MP, not Tim Passmore. There needs to be a change to the funding formula
- Parking will be de-criminalised by April 2019. Police still acting on parking and speeding, but less so.

<u>Planning</u>

- Backlog of applications are gradually coming down
- However, Babergh are currently 6 planning officers down
- A new IT system has been operating since June lots of gremlins. Would have been impossible to run the old and new systems side by side for a period of time

• PCs can ask for paper copies of plans, but Suffolk are trying to move to a paperless system whereby all plans are accessible on line. But this produces problems for PCs with poor internet access. Use of data projectors etc
